I recommend using uppercase given the concept referred to that word ("...Pakatan Rakyat or PR (English: People's Pact / People's Alliance) is an informal Malaysian political coalition. It currently controls three state governments while in opposition to the ruling Barisan Nasional (BN) at the federal level....).</p> <p>Phrases repeated on pages 2 and 3. "Page 2: According to him, transformational leadership has four original dimensions that were precipitated by Bass (1985) which are individual influence, inspirational motivation, intellectual stimulation and individual consideration. Page 3: Rasid Muhammad on the other hand, interpret transformational leadership style as one leadership way that is comprehensive and can be leveraged for individual excellence which able to contribute meaningfully to the organization and the community. There is four dimension of transformational leadership discussed, that are charisma, individual consideration, intellectual stimulation and inspirational motivation." I recommend writing it once. Should be corrected word "transormation" with "TRANSFORMATION".</p> <p>Line 291. Should be noted the meaning of the acronym BN and UMNO , for example BN = Barisan Nasional .</p> <p>The phrase "The Government Transformation Programme (GTP)" is repeated in lines 306 and 311. After being cited for the first time, use abbreviations.</p> <p>Line 366. Missing space between two words "detail oriented". Incorporate it.</p> <p>The Bibliography you must cite according to the "Rules of Writing Magazine." For example: There should not be a point between the abbreviations of the author names.</p>	
<u>Optional/General</u> comments	<p>In this report, it can be seen that Malaysia has one objective overarching of transformative policy: to achieve high income and developed nation status by the year 2020.
