(2000) suggest that safety problems are caused by errors and violation of safety principles</u>".</p> <p><u>Page 1 contains many grammatical and syntax issues.</u></p> <p>Page 6-8 should be divided into 2 sections and each section into paragraphs: <u>Discussion</u> section-still have many syntax issues that can be edited <u>Conclusions</u> section-syntax issues exist and should be edited This manuscript needs good editing.</p>	The manuscript has been grammatically revised accordingly.
