The paper would be more explicit if excellent photographs of the several stages of dysplastic nevi were provided. The authors admit to limited numbers but I felt as though the detail compensated for the numbers problem.</p> <p>Clinicians pay limited attention to dysplastic nevi and this will be certainly helpful for their recognition and understanding.</p> <p>I would accept this paper as there is a dire need for more attention from a clinical-pathology point of reference relevant to this subject.</p>
