Compulsory REVISION comments	I think this paper is generally well-written. The study also investigates an important public health issue. Some specific comments are as below:  1. The paper should specify more clearly how the subjects were chosen. The paper simply mentioned "All elderly persons that met the age criteria fir the study had an equal chance of participating in the research". This is too vague. In addition, what's the year of the survey?  2. There is a difference between perceived eye care needs and actual eye care needs. I think either one is important. However they should not be mixed up. The author should choose one and focus their analysis and discussions on one issue.  3. The manuscript has too many tables. Not all points have to be backed up by a table, or different tables may be combined. In addition, it may be more appropriate to turn the current Table 7 to a regression analysis. Categories of the variables may be combined to make each category having reasonable number of subjects. The two figures in my opinion are not necessary.  4. Since a major part of this study is about barriers to healthcare, I would suggest adding a paragraph briefly describing the health care system in Ghana. For example, the author mentioned "medical insurance cover part of the fees". This sounds confusing to people not familiar with the country. How many people have private health insurance?
