

Line 72-75, illustrations are advised to be list separately.	
Optional/General comments	This manuscript reported a case which indicates that depletion of CD4 cells caused by HIV might make cornea more susceptible to steroid effects. It is a valuable report and I think it is basically acceptable as an article in Ophthalmology Research: An International Journal. However, the points in <i>Minor RVISION comments</i> have to be revised before publication.
