In..... [Sentence deleted to avoid personal communication] The language and presentation are crucial parts in any paper submissions and even more so in a journal publication. In order to have good quality and reputation of the journal, the submitted papers not only should be of good technical quality but also nicely written and presented.

Although the main comments of the reviewers are tackled in the revised paper, there are some grammatical and spelling errors. In addition, the authors should leave spaces between the references numbers and the words; for example simulation[6] in page 2 should be simulation [6], and also check the line spacing between references in the reference section. **My advise that these points to be corrected by the author before final submission to the journal.**

Final decision for manuscript number 2012 PRRI 2945: **Minor Revision.**

The grammatical and spelling errors, and presentation concerns, mentioned above be corrected by the author before final submission to the journal. For language matters, I advise the authors to have the manuscript checked by somebody more familiar with the English Language.
